The best IPM results, according to Joe, are the product of well-trained technicians and cooperative customers. “Colony’s major market is health care; however few of our facilities need any pesticide applications because of the high level of customer cooperation we get. Often, with more cooperation comes less pesticide use,” added Mr. Sheehan.

“Communicating with the customer is a key part of pest control process,” according to Dr. Thomas Green, president of the IPM Institute of North America, who performed the on-site evaluation of Colony’s new service. “IPM is a problem-solving approach - a partnership where the customer and pest management professional work together to reduce pest-friendly conditions. Pests are best managed by fixing the cause of the problem instead of simply treating symptoms.”

Colony works to foster client communication by providing technicians with Blackberry devices. Technicians use these devices to instantly update clients of pest-conducive conditions, such as leaking pipes, holes or cracks, via e-mail. “More often than not, a pest-conducive condition is reported within minutes of us finding it,” explained Mr. Sheehan. “We can begin working with the customer faster and address most issues within 24 hours.”

Colony’s focus on customer communication has resolved numerous challenging pest problems. When a hospital had a persistent drain fly problem, Colony performed a detailed inspection and found a pipe leaking inside the wall. After immediately emailing the client, the hospital discovered that there were several other leaks in the same pipe throughout the building. Repair

and replacement of the pipeline and a very light contact pesticide application stopped the fly activity permanently.
